#### Measles - Information from Waltham Forest Public Health

Measles cases are rising in the UK, and it is likely that there will be outbreaks across London. There have already been large outbreaks of measles in North West London and the West Midlands in 2023. Measles is highly infectious – one case of measles can infect 90% of unvaccinated close contacts (this includes those they share a classroom with). It can also be a really serious illness: for every five children who get measles, one will require a hospital visit; for every fifteen children who get measles, one will be affected by life-limiting conditions, such as blindness, meningitis and sepsis.

The safest and most effective way to protect yourself, the children you care for and your community against measles is to make sure that you and your children are up to date with MMR vaccinations. Two doses of the MMR vaccine provide 99% protection against measles. It is never too late to get your MMR vaccination and you can check whether you or your children are up to date with your vaccinations by contacting your GP or by looking in your child's red book. If you haven't been fully vaccinated (two doses of MMR) then you can get vaccinated at your GP practice. Primary schoolaged children can also get vaccinated at clinics run by Vaccination UK (parents can book by completing the form

https://london.schoolvaccination.uk/polio/2023/Walthamforest).

Halal MMR vaccinations are available and can be requested when you make an appointment.

### Parent WhatsApp Groups

We are aware that each class or Year group has a parent WhatsApp group that is set up by a parent, usually at the beginning of their child's Reception year. These groups are not accessed by the school and are not an official school group however they can be a very useful way for parents to remind each other of events and activities that are happening in school. Parents and Carers do have a code of conduct to follow though during their time at our school and I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that our children and staff should never be discussed in these groups and should never be named. If you have any concerns about your child then you should always contact the school and make an appointment to meet with your class teacher or a member of the Leadership team if appropriate. We appreciate that managing

the conversations within a WhatsApp group, as the parent that has set it up, can be difficult at times and if you do have any concerns about any of the conversations within a group then please do get in touch with the school.

### Children bringing in mobile phones to school

Can I remind parents that children should not be bringing mobile phones into school unless it has been agreed between the school and the parents. Usually the only reason a child in Year 6 and very occasionally Year 5 is allowed to bring in a phone is because they walk to and from school by themselves and even then it is not always necessary depending on the distance your child has to walk. There is no other reason for your child to have a phone in school.

As always, if your child does have a mobile phone at home you should regularly be checking their phones as they can be subject to online abuse and not everyone they communicate with is always who they think they are. It also goes without saying that your children should never have their mobile phones with them in their bedroom when they go to bed as this should be a time when they switch off from the day.

## Scholastics Book Fair & World Book Day



Next week we start our build up to World Book Day by the arrival of our Scholastics book fair on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> February to Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> March. There will be bookcases of books for our youngest to oldest children to buy and they can use their World Book Day voucher which is attached to this newsletter.

The book fair will be run every afternoon from 3.10pm, when the gates open, in the main playground by the bifold doors of the

hall. This year we once again have a card reader so you can pay by cash or on the card reader. For every book sold we get a percentage back in books for our children.

World Book Day is on Thursday 7th March and focuses on reading for pleasure. This year the staff theme is 'Goodies & Baddies' from some of our favourite books. I am dusting off my Cruella Deville wig and finding myself a Dalmatian puppy! The children can follow our theme or they can come dressed as their own favourite book character or even in their pyjamas. We are also asking the children to bring in their favourite book from home as they will have a chance to chill and read during the day.

This involves getting as many girls as we possibly can to play football in a session on 8th March across all schools in Waltham Forest.
